We learned a lot about photo laminators as well as laminating itself in Allan's excellent Craft Talk on his vocation.

Some of the information was startling such as the cost of a laminating sheet producing machine which runs from 5 million to 15 million US dollars! Laminators for business run from \$800.00 to \$330.00. Also available are pouch laminators for as little as \$20.00 at one of the office supply stores.

Lamination started in the 1930's and today most of the laminators are in the Chicago area including Wisconsin.

Allan's company is called D&K Group and is located in Elk Grove Village, Ill which is adjacent to O'Hare Field in Chicago. Allan is responsible for marketing in the Western United States.

Lake Oso is located in Mission Viejo and Rancho Santa Margarita (border line is down the middle of the lake). The Boy Scouts are about to sign a contract with the water district to develop a master plan.

Proposed India School Project – Cooper reported that Rich Frieder and his committee would investigate the proposal and have a recommendation for next Board Meeting.

Pancake Breakfast: Kersten reported that the Club took in \$2,345 at the Breakfast. Kersten recommended that the Club round the figure to \$2,500 and present a check in that amount to Esperanza School Principal. MSC

Thanksgiving Food Baskets – Bob McQueen reported that the Club has budgeted \$500 for food baskets. Kersten provided each Director with a report that presents the Club's cash flow with comparison to budget.
