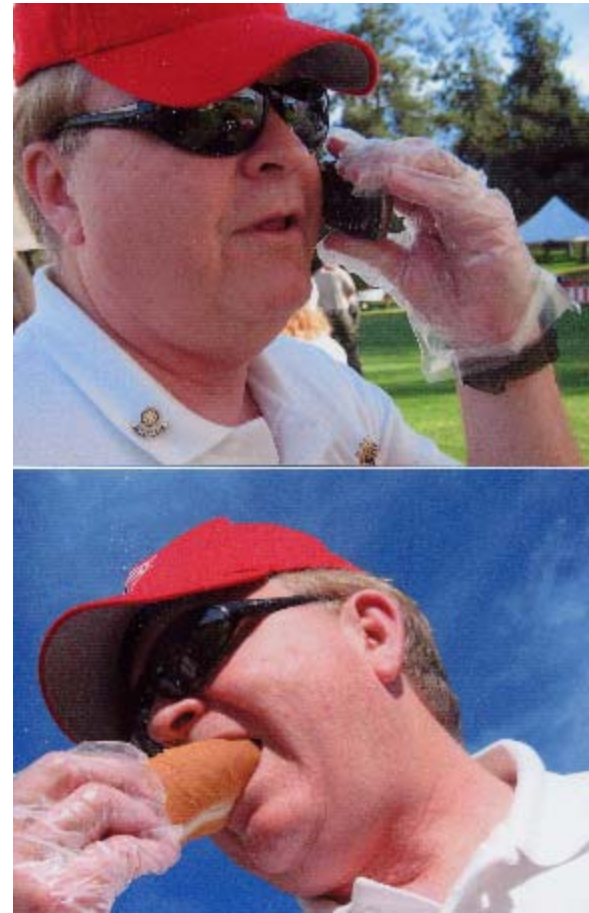
#### FORMER MEMBER LEN WHITE ON RETIREMENT
