Seattle club inducts William H. Gates Sr. as honorary member

William H. Gates Sr., chairman of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, has long been a friend of Rotary. In 2002, he presented The Rotary Foundation with the Gates Award for Global Health in recognition of Rotary's leadership in public health initiatives. He also spoke to a conference of large Rotary clubs in Seattle last year. And Gates has been an occasional guest of the Rotary Club of Seattle.

Recognizing Gates's many contributions to civic, business, and cultural institutions and his commitment to Rotary ideals, the Seattle club inducted him as an honorary member at its 6 August meeting. Gates is a former colleague of Todd Summerfelt, president of the Seattle club. Summerfelt once asked Gates if he had ever considered joining Rotary. "Bill replied that friends had talked to him about it before, but they supposed that his classification was already filled," Summerfelt said. "A great example of why it was time to change our old classification system."

At his induction, however, Gates revealed to the club's members that his Rotary history went back farther than most of them might have guessed. While Gates was studying law at the University of Washington, the Rotary Club of University District of Seattle chose a select group of student leaders and named them student members of the club. So as early as 1948, Gates was attending meetings and getting a taste of what Rotary had to offer.
