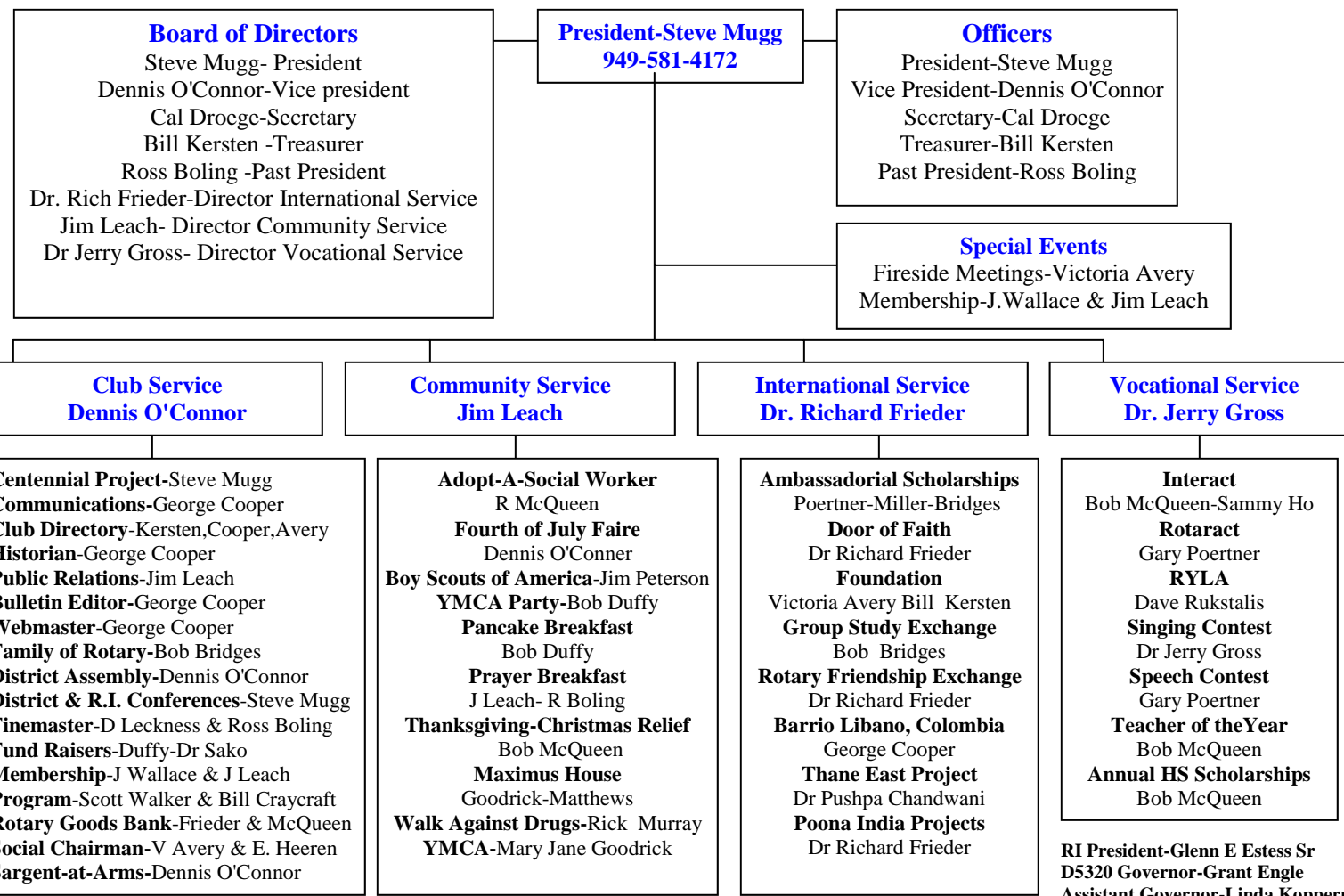

MY CRAFT TALK...My career is exciting to me, but I don't really really do anything that I consider interesting or exciting to others. So, as I tried to figure out what to say, I thought back to the past few years and the District's Principal for a Day program. I always have shared some statistics and the participants seemed, or acted, interested - maybe they were just being polite. Anyway, you're going to get that data:

Capistrano Unified School District was founded in 1965 and covers 195 square miles which includes seven cities and a part of the unincorporated area of Orange County. The district serves 50,000 children on 55 campuses and is the largest employer in South Orange County with 4,400 full and part time employees.

To service those kids are:
 36 Elementary Schools
 10 Middle Schools
 5 High Schools and 4 Special Centers.

The Communities serviced are seven cities as well as a portion of Unincorporated Orange County: Aliso Viejo, Dana Point, Laguna Niguel, Mission Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita, Camp Pendleton, San Clementi, San Juan Capistrano and the communities of Coto de Caza, Dove Canyon, Ladera Ranch, Las Flores and Wagon Wheel.

The District Ethnic Composition is:
 70% White, 18% Hispanic, 5% Asian and 7% Other.

The Budget totals \$514.7 million of which \$187.6 million is restricted.

Jim is Principal of Niguel Hills Middle School (6th, 7th and 8th grades) with 1504 students (3,000 parents) and 65 teachers and their program goal is to Connect with the Kids:

Shark Mentors- A teacher takes on a targeted student meets with the student weekly.

Lunch Buddies: Sit and eat lunch with new kids.

Mandatorian- Mandatory tutorial at lunch time.

Rotarian Jim and his wife Catherine live in Mission Viejo and they have two sons and one granddaughter.

Dr Raj Desai the guest speaker who was introduced by **PP Krishna Matur*** is truly a remarkable man. He is a cancer specialist by profession and works in Bilbao. US. He joined the Rotary Club there and started a Matching grant Project with the Rotary Club of Mysore India called "Deaf India". Teenage girls are given Rubella vaccine. This prevents deafness in new born children at a later date when these children become mothers.

Dr Deasi has been able to convince many State governments about the need to vaccinate teenage girls. He has started a National campaign for prevention of deafness in India to reduce deafness at least by 50%. Children who are born deaf have to be identified early and from the second month itself they have to be given treatment and training. A sign language needs to be developed for this country(India).

He wants to start an institution to provide vocational training and higher education to deaf, dumb and intellectually challenged persons.
