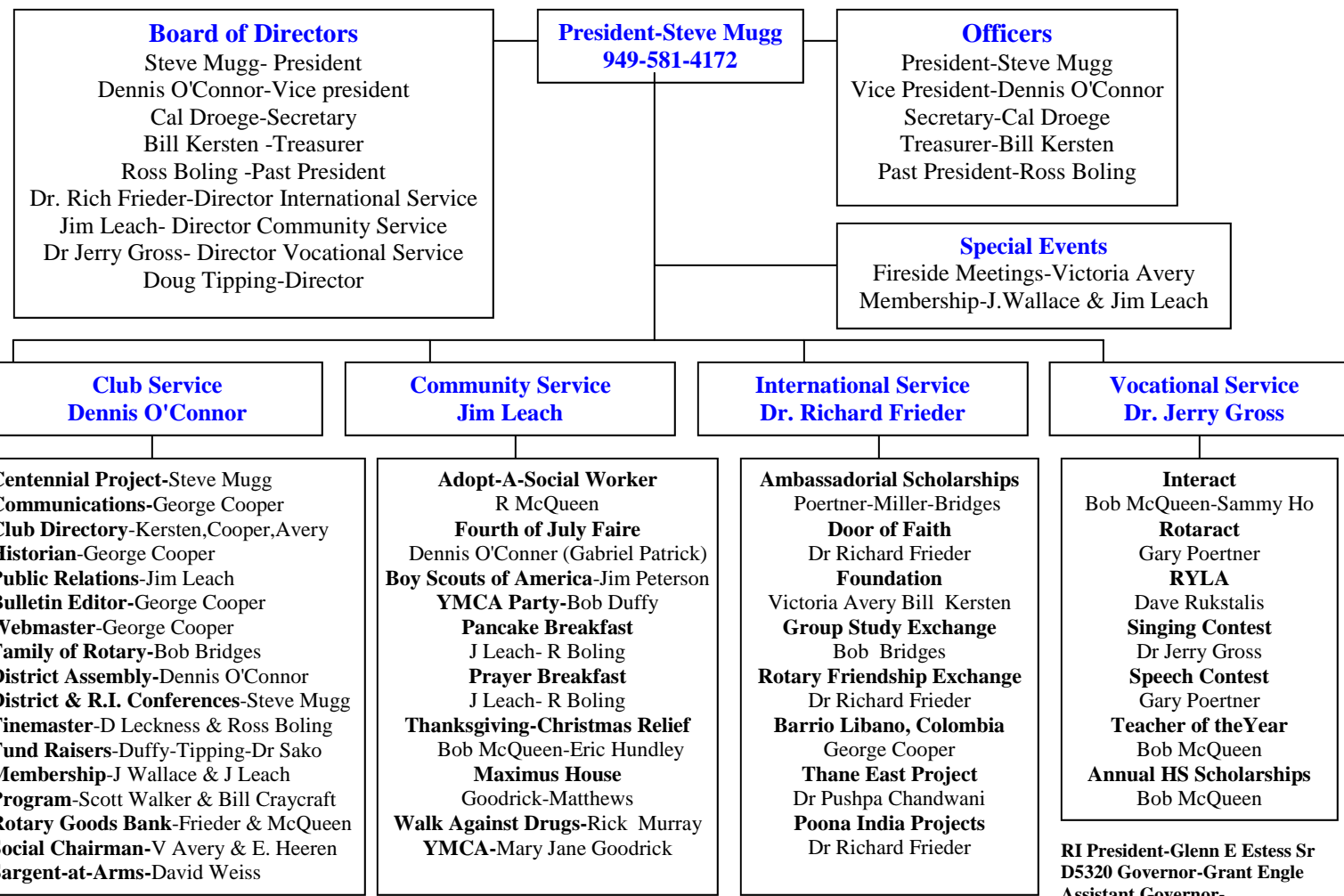

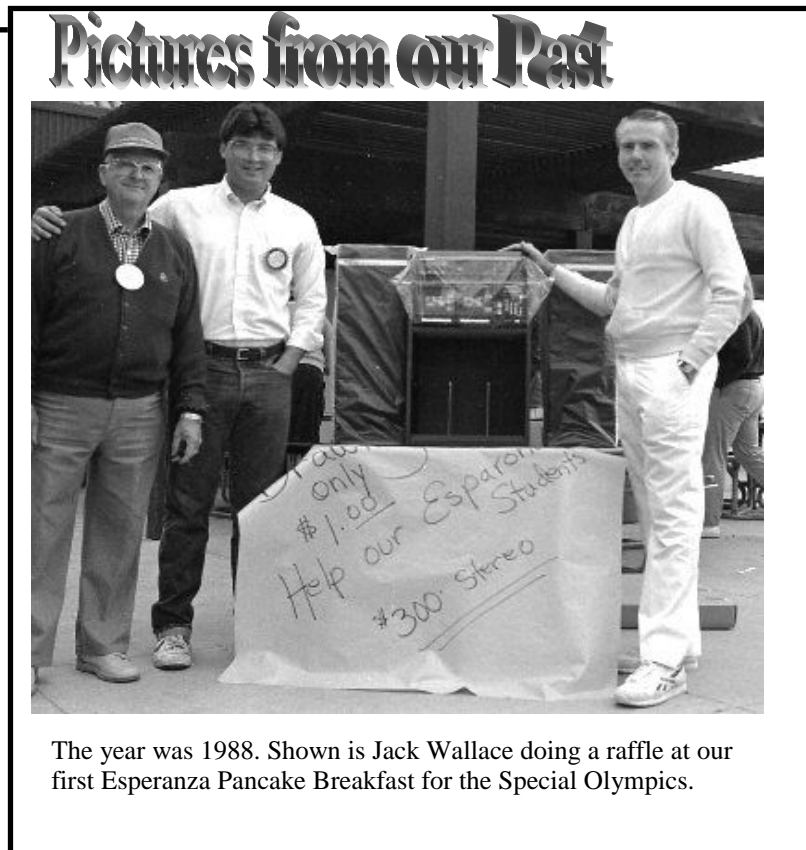

AUGUST BOARD MEETING NOTES

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1. RI Insurance Coverage report received and reviewed by Mugg. Secretary was directed to file coverage report with minutes of this meeting.
2. District Conference will be May 21, 2005 with Hospitality Night at the Atlantis Play House and the conference at the Doubletree. Theme: Space Cowboy
3. MV Rotary Club's 30th Anniversary Party: Set for September 13th 6:30 at El Adobe Mexican Restaurant in San Juan Capistrano. Cost will be \$25 per person and will serve as that weeks Club meeting. (no morning meeting on the 14th of September.
4. Centennial Project – Mugg reported that the long term lease between Water District and Boy Scouts is now in place. Boy Scouts have submitted plans to its Architect. Eventually there will be a formal rendering.
5. Mugg reported that he has appointed a Fundraiser Review Committee consisting of Victoria Avery and Ed Heeren. The committee to review fund raising opportunities including the Improv event.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

LIBANO: Frieder recommended budget of \$3,000 this year for the Building Fund in Libano

POONA: Frieder has discussed options with Poona Club. Options include Cleft Pallet and other surgery funding. Budget of \$1,000 is anticipated.

DOOR OF FAITH: Frieder reported that the Well at the school is dry. Water is provided by a neighbor. They need a new well and preliminary cost estimate is \$20,000 to \$40,000. The Directors discussed funding options. Kersten reported that the Woodland Hills Rotary would participate in funding. The Directors asked Rich Frieder to investigate possibility of District Simplified Grant Program as possible source of \$1,500. Frieder to report to Board at September meeting. Frieder requested funding of Tuition, uniforms and supplies for ten students at a cost of \$600. Our Club has funded tuition in the past. After discussion it was MSC to fund the tuition.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Entertainment Books-Aaron Sako requested authority to order Entertainment books. After discussion the Board authorized 200 books.
2. Chamber of Commerce – Annual dues of \$235 is now payable if the Club chooses to maintain its membership in the Chamber. After discussion it was MSC to renew

ORANGE COUNTY SHERIFF MIKE CORONA REPORTS

Sheriff Corona talked to us about the current state of law enforcement in Orange County as well as the newly formed Government Performance Review Commission established by Governor Arnold and which Mike is serving as a no-pay volunteer. The purpose is to engage in the public ideas of how to restructure our State government to reduce the huge budget deficient by downsizing. Public Hearings will be held during August and September and then the commission will write up recommendations to the Governor. Sheriff Corona is appealing to Rotary Clubs to do their part by participating in these debates.

On law enforcement, Sheriff Corona talked about the Amber Alert now mandatory in all counties in California. This Protection of Children program was borrowed from Texas by Orange County and out of 45 alerts...45 were successful in returning the children in California and Nationwide to date 145 cases resulted in 145 successful results.

Regarding homeland security...Sheriff Corona is a Senior Adviser and has met on occasions with President Bush. In Orange County, the Sheriff's Department addressed Terrorism after 9/11 and in two years build a homeland security program.
