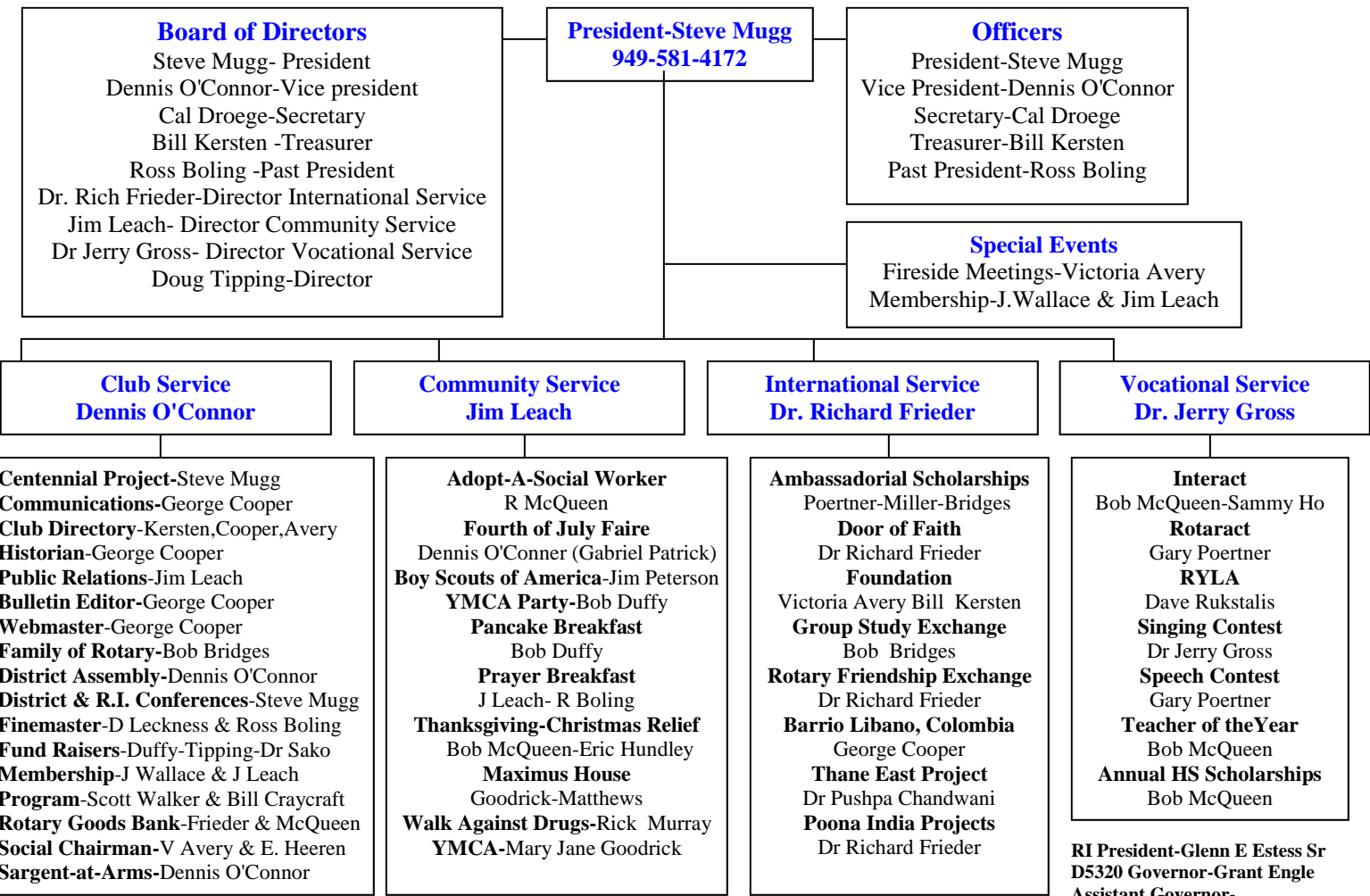

Report from board meeting of November 11, 2004

President's Announcements: Business Meeting – Mugg announced that the regular Club Meeting on December 28, 2004 be devoted to Club Business. At this meeting, among other things, the membership is required to vote on the proposed slate of officers for 2005/2006

Membership Book- Mugg reported that George Cooper, Bill Kersten and Victoria Avery recommend that we discontinue the existing Membership Book given to members. This is the blue ring booklet. Kersten points out that the member information is presently posted on the Club's website. After discussion it was MSC to discontinue the printed version of the Membership Book and refrain from spending Club funds for book supplies

Mugg announced that District 5320 is considering an event to be known as the **District 5320 Centennial Celebration**. The proposed date is April 2005. If event is adopted each Club would invest \$1,000 to participate. Clubs to receive a bicycle built for two to be ridden in the event. More information to follow.

Business Rotarian of the Year – Mugg requested nominations for this recognition

Service Award for Excellence – Mugg requested nominations of non-Rotarian candidates for this recognition.

CLUB SERVICE: RI International Convention – Boling suggested that the Club increase the existing budget for Present Elect to attend the International Convention. Existing Budget is \$1,000 Domestic and \$1,500 International. This budget amount was not used the past year. Proposed amount would be \$1,500 Domestic and \$2,500 International. INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

LIBANO: Frieder reported that he is submitting grant with objective of raising about \$15,000 for the building project. Project to use our funding of \$3,000 which is already included in our budget and paid, Plus \$3,000 from Libano Club

DOOR OF FAITH: Frieder to submit application to District 5320 for a Grant of \$1,500 for a Pump House for the new well. Frieder to report to the Board upon receiving District's decision

PROJECT DEAF INDIA – Frieder reported that Pushpa will be in India in December and will meet with the Poona Club to explore viability of this project and serum availability.

COMMUNITY SERVICE Thanksgiving Food Baskets – McQueen submitted his request for authority to for authority to prepare 15 Food Baskets for distribution to local needy families. Budget has \$600 for Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets. Recommend spending approximately \$400 on the Thanksgiving Baskets. The Board approved the expenditure.

NEW BUSINESS: Frames – Mugg requested authority to purchase the 8x10 frames for the 4 Way Test and Object of Rotary presented to new members. Mugg noted that the new member's initiation fee covers the cost of the items. MSC to approve purchase

100% Paul Harris Fellow – Mugg asked the board to consider participation in the 100% Paul Harris program. Mugg presented information regarding existing member Paul Harris status. The Board discussed options that would bring members into the program. Mugg shall ask Victoria Avery to review the program, contact members who are not fellows and report back to Mugg early in December.

Rotary Shirts/Hats – Mugg suggested that the Club invest in Shirts/Hats with Rotary logo. Our present inventory is pretty much gone. Droege said he knew of a specialty shop that could make the shirts and caps on a custom basis. This means the Rotary Wheel plus the actual name of our club on each shirt. Mugg asked Droege to determine costs and report to next Board Meeting.
