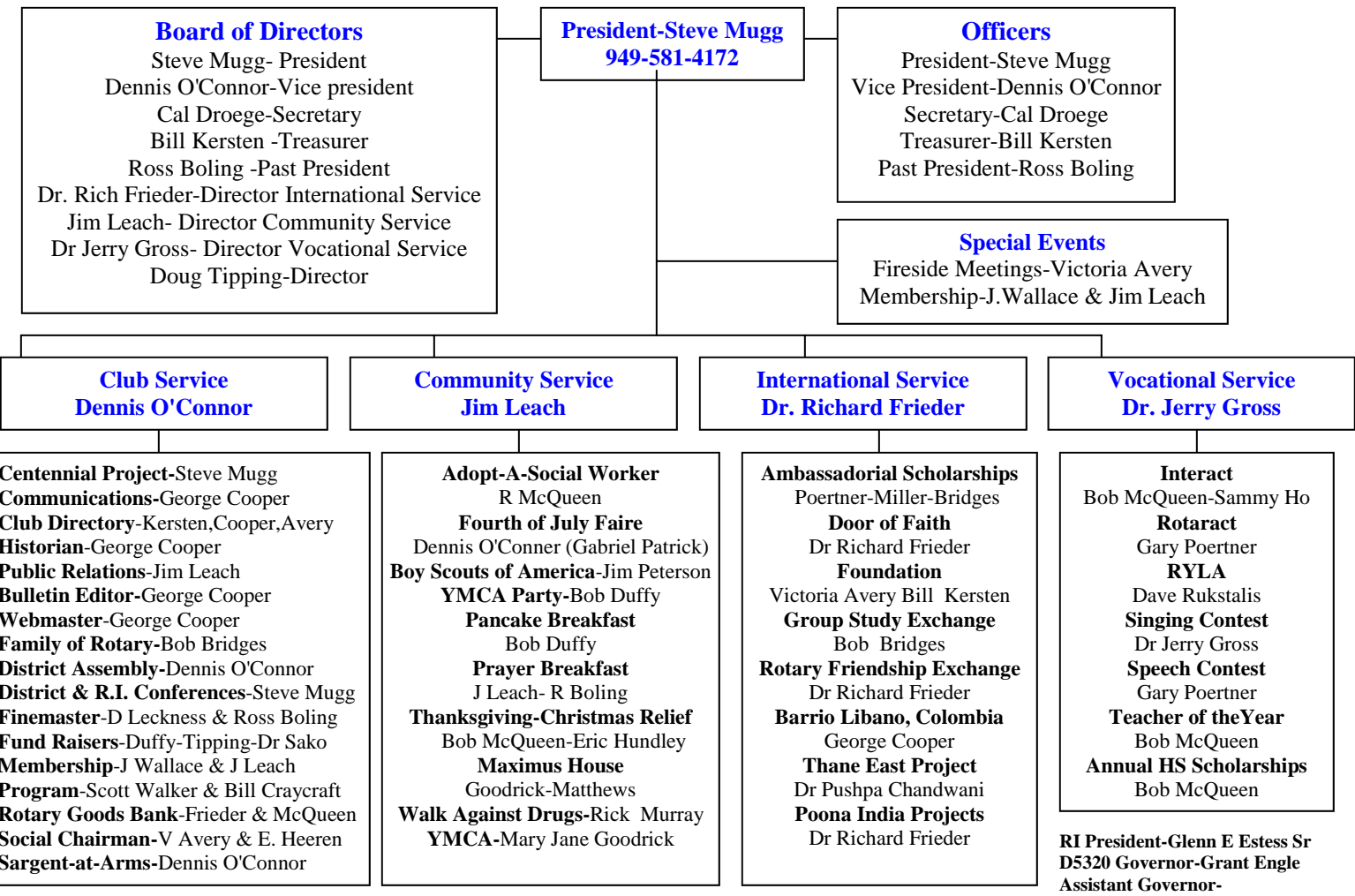

## NEWS FROM OUR JANUARY 2005 Board of Directors meeting

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Steve Mugg)

100% Paul Harris Fellow participation – Mugg reported that he has completed his research regarding status of Paul Harris Fellows/Sustaining Members and non participating Club Members. There are members who are not participating. Proposed to obtain commitments from those members and if successful initiate program to fund their PHF accounts. The Board MSC to approve the program subject to gaining member confirmation. Goal of President is to for MV Rotary to be recognized at Foundation Dinner on Feb 16, 2005

Board Member at Large – Mugg announced that Doug Tipping resigned from our Club. This creates a vacancy in the position of Board Member at Large. Mugg to consider candidates and will provide his recommendation at the next Board Meeting.

### CLUB SERVICE: (Dennis O'Connor)

**Centennial Project** – Mugg requested input on the design options for the entry at Camp Rotary—Oso Reservoir. Important items for consideration: Use of Rotary Wheel; Identification of Mission Viejo Rotary and the Camp Rotary name

### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE (Rich Frieder):

**LIBANO:** Frieder reported he had discussion with former Club member who is now a member of Yorba Linda Rotary regarding possibility of joining and combining club funds to develop matching grant possibilities of nearly \$40,000 for projects in Libano. The Board encouraged Frieder to continue to explore this option.

**DOOR OF FAITH:** Frieder reported that he has filed the Water Pump House Project details with District 5320 as required for having received the Grant of \$1,500

**POONA** – Frieder reported that the Poona Club intends to use MV Rotary contribution of \$1,000 to provide immunizations for Rubella

**PROJECT DEAF INDIA** – Frieder reported that Pushpa has returned from India and will report her findings at an upcoming meeting

**TSUNAMI DISASTER RELIEF**– The Board had extensive discussion of the Disaster and the efforts by various organizations to provide aid.

Mugg reported that District Governor had a message at the President's meeting to the effect that Club's do not need to rush into a decision on the nature or extent of aid to be donated. District 5320 will organize a means to contribute for District Clubs. Additional information to be provided as the extent of the disaster can be better assessed

Frieder and O'Connor reported contact with Rotary Club of Colombo Regency in Sri Lanka. Email messages have been exchanged to establish a means of communication with this Rotary Club. Objective here is to develop an ongoing Club relationship similar to Poona and Libano.

Mugg suggested that the Board consider approval of allocation of \$5,000 for relief to the effected area.

**Toby's House** – Mugg reported that we will present our contribution to Toby's House at program in March

**Speech contest**- Mugg reported that posters have been placed at the High Schools and we plan to complete the contest before February 14, 2005

## TSUNAMI DISASTER RELIEF

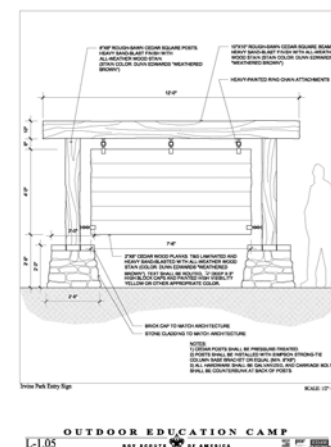

Your International Committee would like to establish a working relationship with the Colombo club and give help as time goes on as well as an initial donation of \$3,000 to \$5,000. It is felt that our preference is to work through a Rotary Club rather than contributing our donation to a pot (such as any of the other good charitable organizations including our district has set up).

## International Service Report

### JOINT EFFORT TO FIGHT RUBELLA BY VACCINATING TEENS IN POONA, INDIA

The Rotary Clubs of Mission Viejo, Newport Beach and Poona, India have joined forces with Project Deaf India to start the Rubella vaccination of teenage girls of the City of Pune, India. The purpose is to prevent deafness, blindness, heart disease as well as mental retardation caused by Rubella.

Dr Raj Desai just returned from a trip to Pune and reports that the plan includes charging those that can afford it and using the difference in cost to vaccinate slum girls at no charge. The cost of the vaccine is \$1.00 and the plan is to charge \$2.00 and use the profit to vaccinate many more subjects.

So far, each of the clubs (mentioned above) have donated \$1000 per club for a total of \$3,000.

Rotarian Dr Pushpa Chandwani has also just returned from India and plans to give us a first hand report of her visit which includes the Project Deaf India Vaccination of Teens Program.

### LIBANO, COLOMBIA BUILDING FUND DONATION

Mission Viejo Rotary sends help to Libano Colombia House Building Fund with \$1,000 check.
