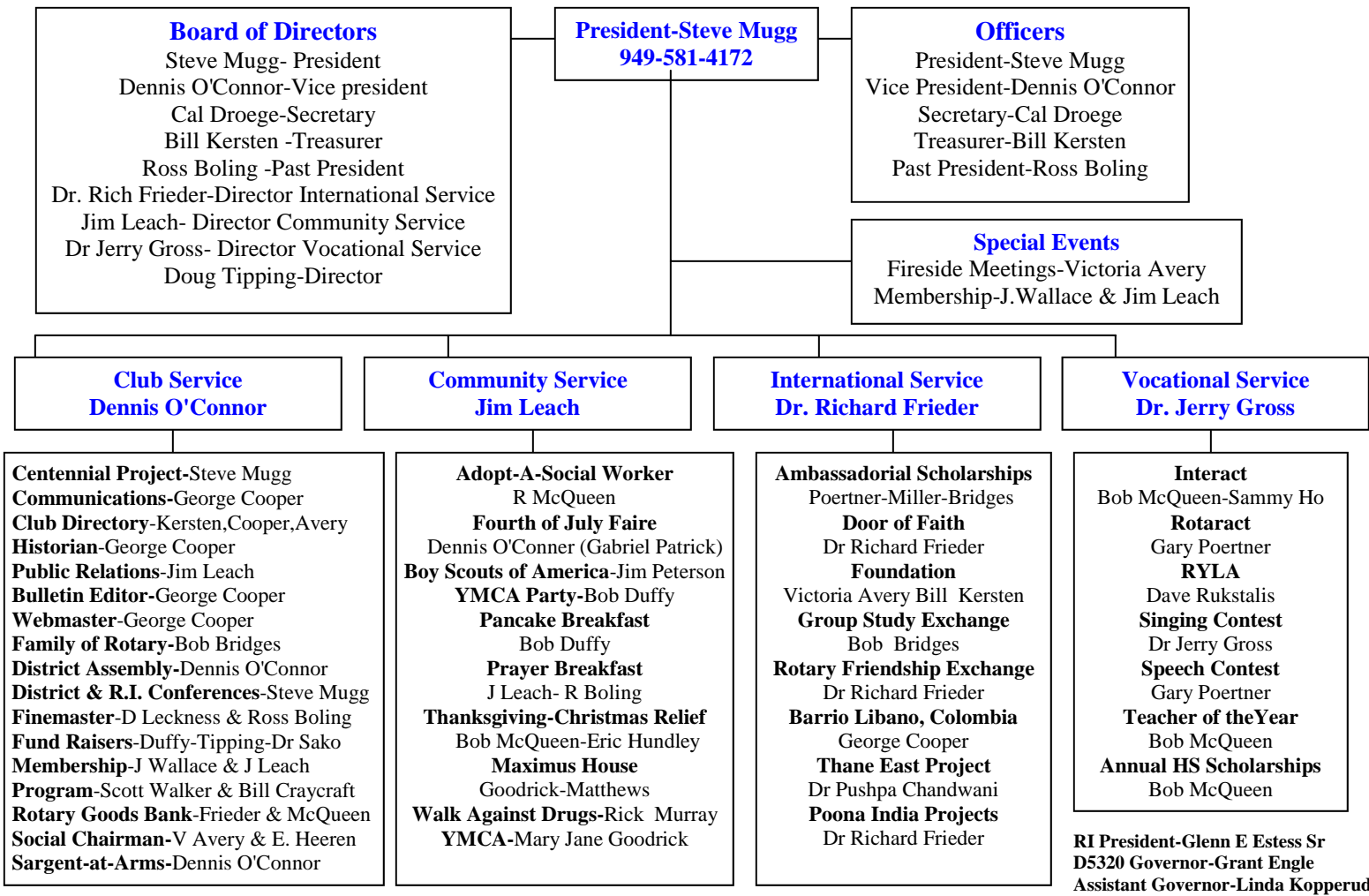

## REPORT FROM ROTARY CLUB OF THANE East INDIA on our MATCHING GRANT PROJECT

Dear Pushpa:

Our Matching Grant Project is progressing very well.

In fact 80 % of the project is almost over.

We have already commissioned following items.

- 1) Six computers with Windows XP and placed on Platf Dear orm. PC's are ready for use.
  - 2) all new benches, tables , fans and Tube lights in classroom are fitted and ready for use.
  - 3) all science Lab instruments are received  
We have to get only Physical Balance.
  - 4) Science Lab cupboards are fitted.
  - 5)Drinking water tank of 2000 ltrs and 200 ltrs in Hall are installed.  
Water pump installed and started. All pipes and fittings are over. We had a trial of supplying water to first floor tank and distributed to toilets and to water cooler
  - 4) Water cooler with filter and water purifier is installed.  
LCD projector has been received It is HP make.
  - 5)Sound system with amplifier and mikes has been insalled and commissioned.
- Following items for Vocational centre are remaining ., which are available ex-stock
- a) Sewing Machines
  - b) Electricians equipments.

We had re-negotiated all the prices of all items. Since prices have come down we got better deal with reduced prices . Also this is Rotary project therefore vendors gave additional discount volunterily. We have save good amount in this project . With permission of Rotary Foundation we will add same items with more nos.so that we can use all the money in the project.

I will send you later a complete table of all items with actual coast. I have also taken new photograps which I will attach from next mail.

We hope to complete the project by 20th March so that we can make a final report.It was a challenging job completed by our Rotarians.
