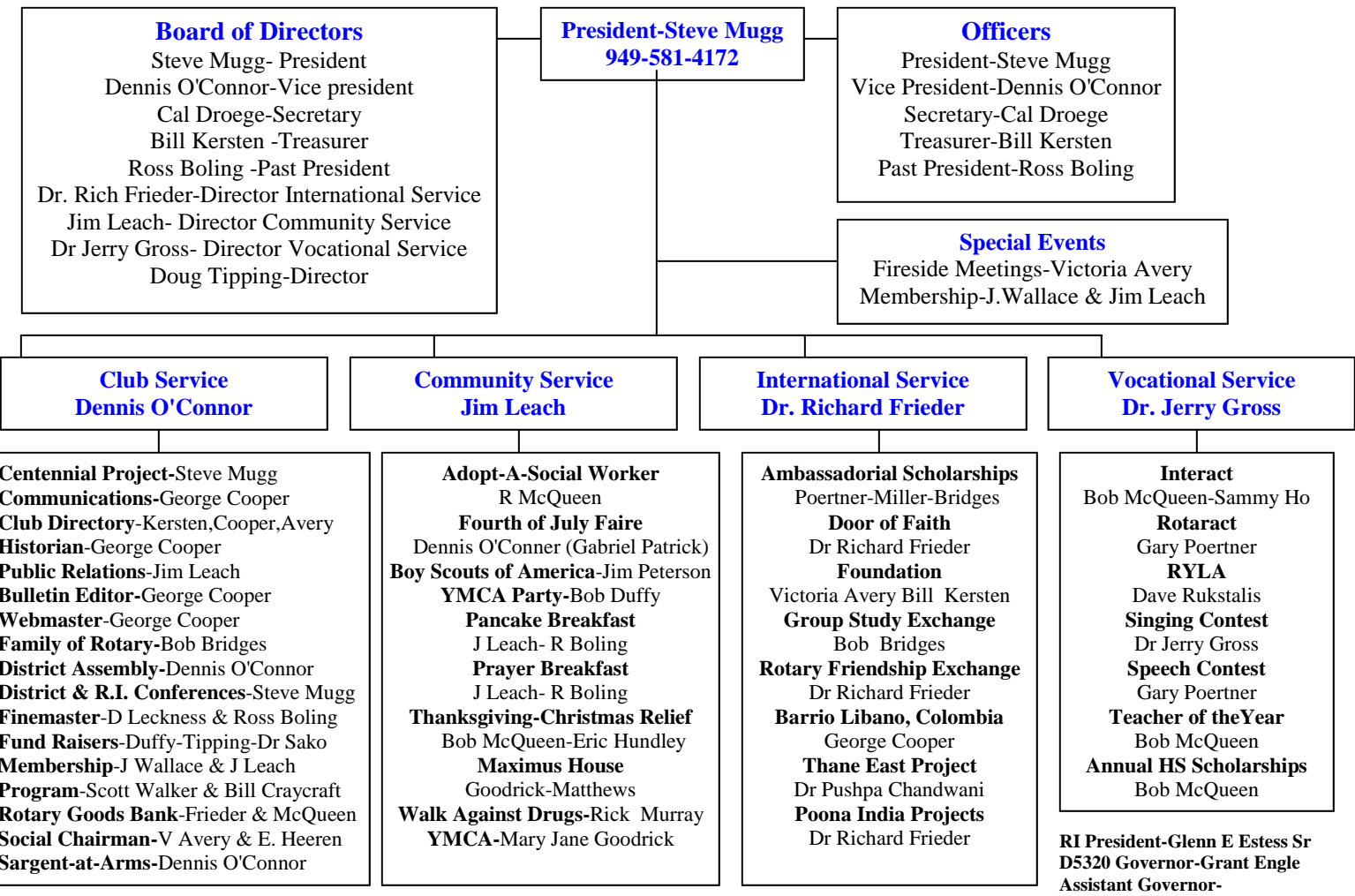

Free red T shirts were given to the first 3500 participants. Our club, as in the past, cooked and gave out free hot dogs in a bun. This year we cooked and the crowd devoured 750 hot dogs! Next year we plan to cook up over 1,000!! The first walk was held in 1989 and your club was a participant. The event has grown larger every year and now Mission Viejo's Walk Against Drugs is one of the largest and most successful events of its kind in Orange County. The event is sponsored by the Orange County's Sheriff's Deapartment and the City of Mission Viejo.



D.G. GRANT ENGLE WALKED WITH US THROUGH THE PATH OF ROTARY



In a fast moving presentation, District Governor Grant Engle gave us an exciting history of Rotary's adventure in service marking the Celebration of Rotary's 100 years.

First, though, DG Grant marched us through our club's own 30 Year path with Rotary, listing the many projects our club has created and carried out from our very beginning including reporting that over the 30 years our club and members have contributed a total of \$108,000 to the Rotary Foundation.

DG Grant's walk through Rotary started in 1905 when postage was only 2 cents, bread 2cents a loaf, milk 4 cents per gallon, a luxurious home only \$2000 And only 14% of the homes in America had bathrooms! 1907 brought the fist Hershey kisses as Rotary started to add more clubs In 1909 the LA Club was born ..1912 brought us lapel pins and in 1922 Rotary International became a reality. In the 1930's our 4 Way Test was put in to action and still plays a vital part in business and organizations.

The 1920's and 30's brought lots of Rotary bashing including the play Our Town and the novel Babbit. But Rotary survived and became an active force in the formation of the United Nations in 1945 and most of the charter was written by Rotarians and seven of the original signers of the UN Charter were Rotarians. And even today, Rotary occupies an office in the UN building in New York...the only outside organization to do so and Rotary is an official adviser to the UN.

DG Grant then spoke reverently about Polio Plus and about the rewarding world of our Foundation. He reminded us that ,today ,the same \$1,000 is all you need to become a Paul Harris Fellow , the same as was required when the Foundation started and yet everything else costs far more...like milk is now \$4.00/gallon and bread \$2.50 per loaf! He urged our club to be a 100% PHF Club. He also urged us to continue working on the this years 4 goals for Rotary: 1.Family of Rotary-2.Health-3.Literacy and 4.Clean Water.



As a parting thought, our district governor announced that over two million six hundred thousand people march under the Rotary banner See left. (1,200,000 are Rotarians) and continue to reach out to the world!
