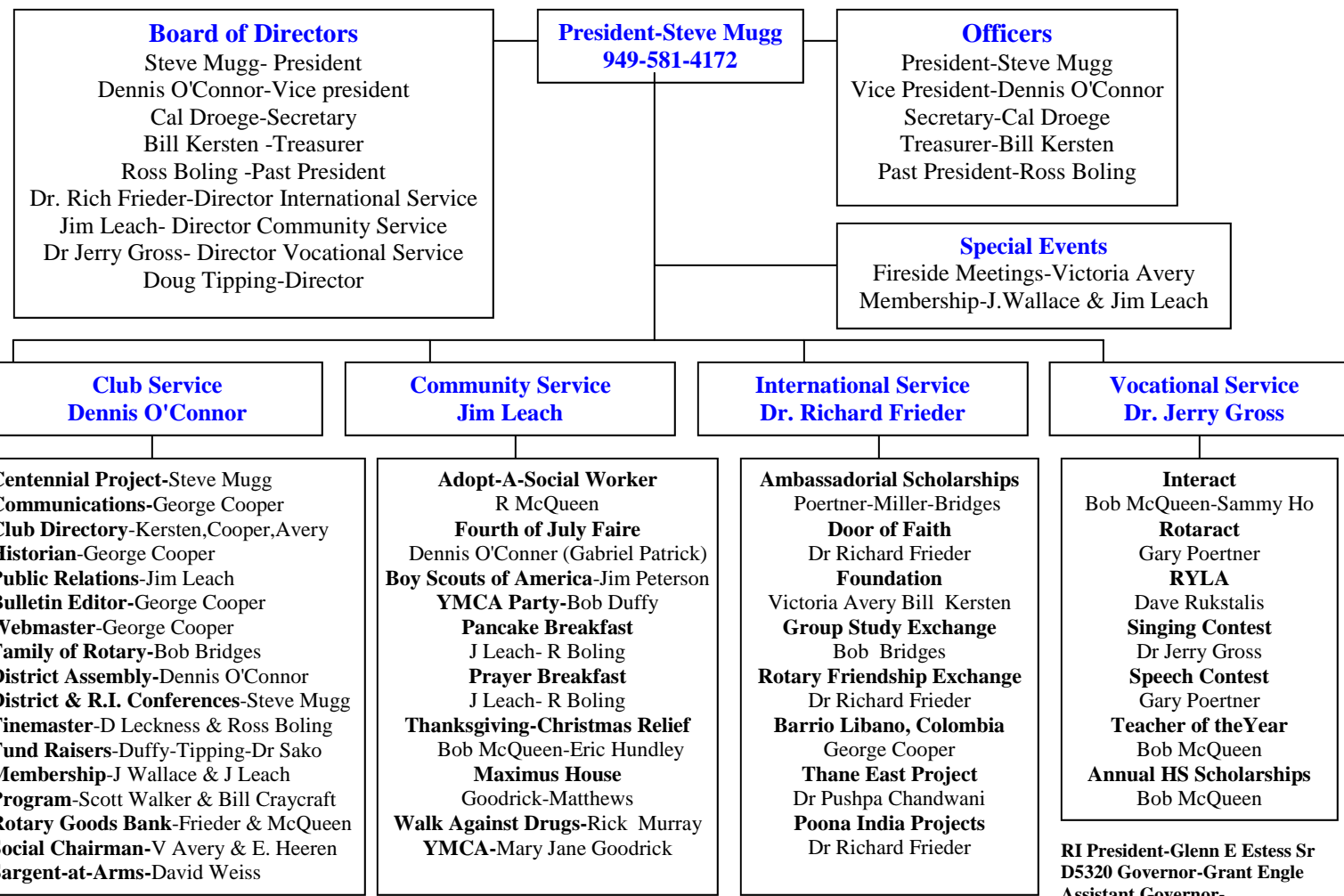

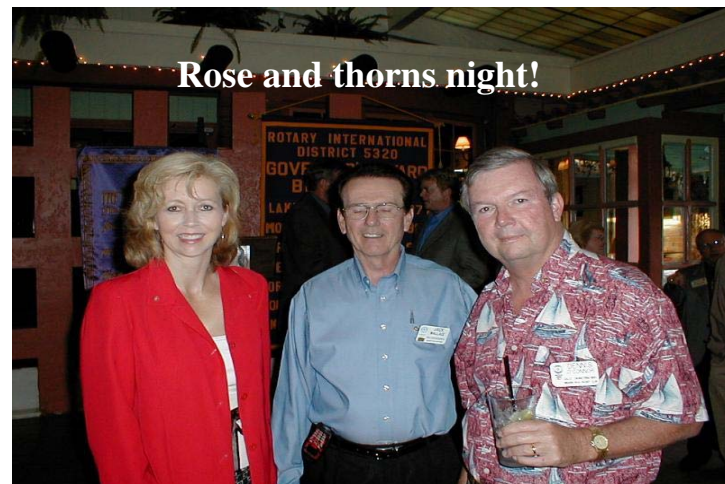
Over sixty members and spouses/friends celebrated the occasion including our District Governor who presented our club with a special citation from R.I. marking the occasion.

A PROCLAMATION FROM THE CITY OF MISSION VIEJO



The citation reads in part: *Whereas the Mission Viejo Rotary Club was founded on September 13, 1974 and is comprised of business and professional leaders who provide humanitarian service and help to build goodwill and peace throughout the world. Whereas during thirty years of service, the Mission Viejo Rotary Club has participated in a wide variety of community events, has awarded college scholarships to local students, has sponsored high school and college-level Rotary Club programs as well as local districts Teacher of the Year Awards programs and Whereas the Mission Viejo Rotary Club was recently recognized as the "Club of the Year" by Rotary International District 5320*

BOARD MEETING REPORTS

CLUB SERVICE: Centennial project- Mugg reported that the Boy Scouts are starting to improve the site. First stage is set to begin in October.

Armed Services Comfort Project- O'Connor reports a good response from members and expects the project to create a benefit to our service members. Frieder added that he had made contact to acquire quantities of Wet Eyes (personal eye drops from a pharmaceutical company).

VOCATIONAL SERVICE: Boling reported that we received a request from Rotary del Sol that they would like to take over the Interact Club at Trabuco HS and it was granted.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE: Frieder recommended a budget of \$3,000 this year for the Building Fund at Libano, Colombia which was approved.

Poona: Frieder has discussed options with Poona Club anticipated a budget of \$1,000 for possibility of surgeries. And we will be re-evaluating other projects. The Cleft Lip project has reached it's goal.

Door of Faith: Frieder reported that the well at the school is still dry after drilling 200 ft and then 300 ft and recommendation from DJ is that we do not invest in a dry hole. **PROJECT DEAF INDIA:** Frieder recommended that we contribute \$1,000 the Deaf India Project which was approved. We will also be exploring doing a joint project with the Poona Club re: Deaf India.

Dr Pushpa Chandwani will also be visiting Poona in December and will explore other possibilities.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Gifts in Kind- Frieder reported that the annual membership fee of \$600.00 was due. He recommended that we re-evaluate and select the stores for our program. MSC to approve expenditure.

SPECIAL EVENTS: Frieder suggested that the Club underwrite the cost of meals for Dinner at El Adobe for our 30th Anniversary and funds to come from our Meals Budget which will not affect our Charity Funds.

MEMBERSHIP: Droege reported that our Club Attendance for August had dropped to 72% - a substantial decline from our normal attendance. Club Membership is 44.
