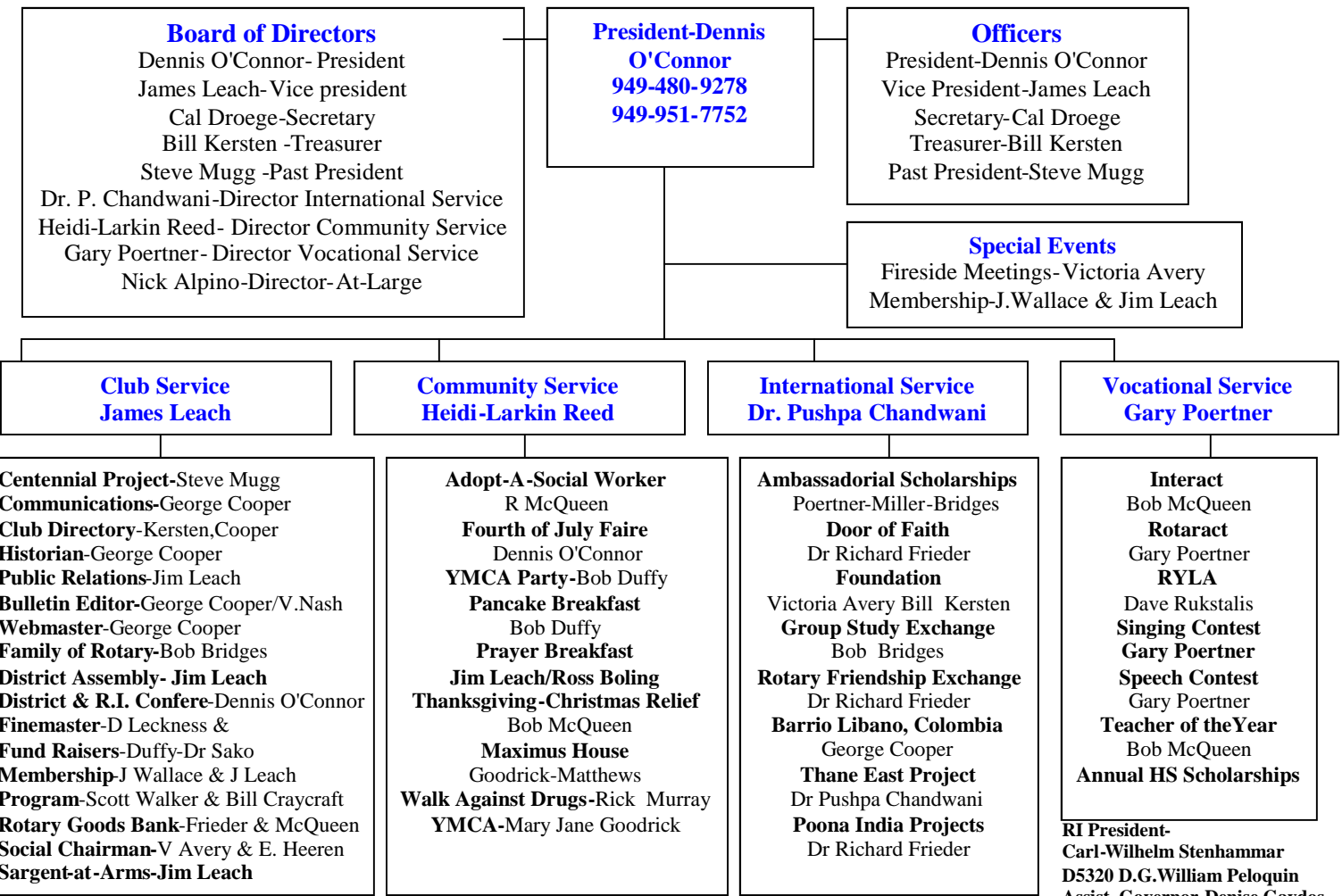

Dr. McCullough expressed appreciation for our club's support of the schools Model UN Program and reported that the students have earned awards at every session in which they participated including beating Harvard University recently. He also told plans of constructing the Saddleback College Vetrans memorial to honor faculty, staff, and students of the college who have served in the armed forces.

Rotaract is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young men and women ages 18 to 30. Rotaract clubs are usually community-based or university-based and are sponsored by a local Rotary club making them true "partners in service" and key members of the Rotary family.

Through the Rotaract program, young adults not only augment their knowledge and skills, but they also address the physical and social needs of their communities while promoting international understanding and peace through a framework of friendship and service.

One of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service, with more than 7,600 Rotaract clubs in some 158 countries,
