

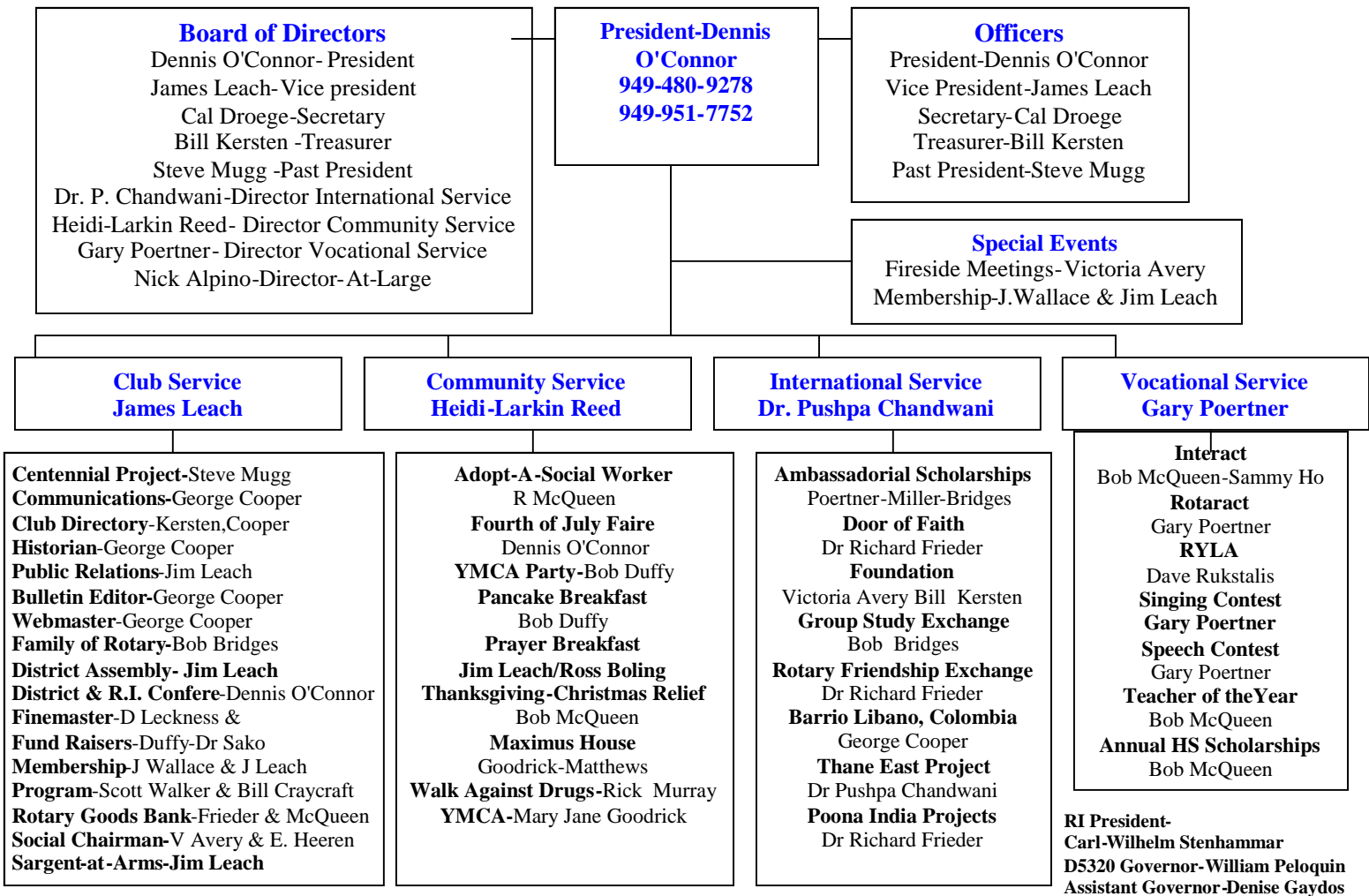

ROTARY GOODS BANK MAY HAVE A NEW LOOK

Rotary Goods Bank Director, Richard Frieder called a special meeting of member Rotarians after our regular meeting of August 2nd. Richard invited a cross section of our members to give him some feedback on the future of the Rotary Goods bank. Richard announced that the "Goods in Kind" contract will be coming up for renewal in September which requires our club to pay a total of at least \$1,000 to the various donor organizations to cover their administrative fee. We must decide which organizations we wish to continue with and also what plans do we have for this Rotary year in donating the goods to needy organizations and how to go about doing so.

It was decided that Richard meet with Bill Kersten and Bob McQueen and present a recommendation to the Board.

MATCHING GRANT PROPOSAL FOR LIBANO COLOMBIA COFFEE PROJECT

International Service Director Pushpa Chandwani met in July with Brian Cooper, Richard Frieder and George Cooper regarding a matching grant proposal and the following is a report of that meeting:

1. Richard submitted a very comprehensive check list on the preparation of the Matching grant Application.. Brian will use this as a guide and gather the necessary data to make this a successful grant and submit the information to Richard who will complete the application.
 2. The application will be fine tuned by both Richard and Pushpa (who you will recall have made a successful Matching Grant for the Thane India Club).
 3. The application will then be submitted to Mike Brunholder, Matching Grants Director for our D5320. Mike will carefully review same and if he feels changes or revisions need to be made to increase the odds for approval by R.I., he will let us know.
 4. Richard also has received an offer from the Yorba Linda Club to participate with us on this International Service Project.
 5. The amount of the grant we are shooting for is \$24,999.
 6. We will be asking our club to donate \$3,000 and Yorba Linda to donate \$3,000
 7. Libano Club will donate whatever they can afford which probably will not be much more than \$100.00
 8. Brian will then ask his district to donate \$1,000.
 9. We will then ask our district to donate the balance to bring the total request for R.I. to match so that the total amounts to a dollar under the \$25,000.
 10. Brian submitted samples of the coffee for the three of us to try and showed us the packaging. Brian also outlined his plans for marketing the coffee and has already been promised by a Libano Grocery chain to sell the coffee in their stores. The coffee is currently being sold in a local store in Libano Brian also has a contact with offices both in Chicago and in Bogato offering to help on exporting the coffee once enough is produced.
 11. Previous to the meeting, Richard had contacted R.I. and R.I. is very much in favor of this kind of grant and likes the proposal very much.
- Note: Brian was only in town for a few days and was unable to be in town on a Tuesday (when he normally would address our club and sends his regrets)*
