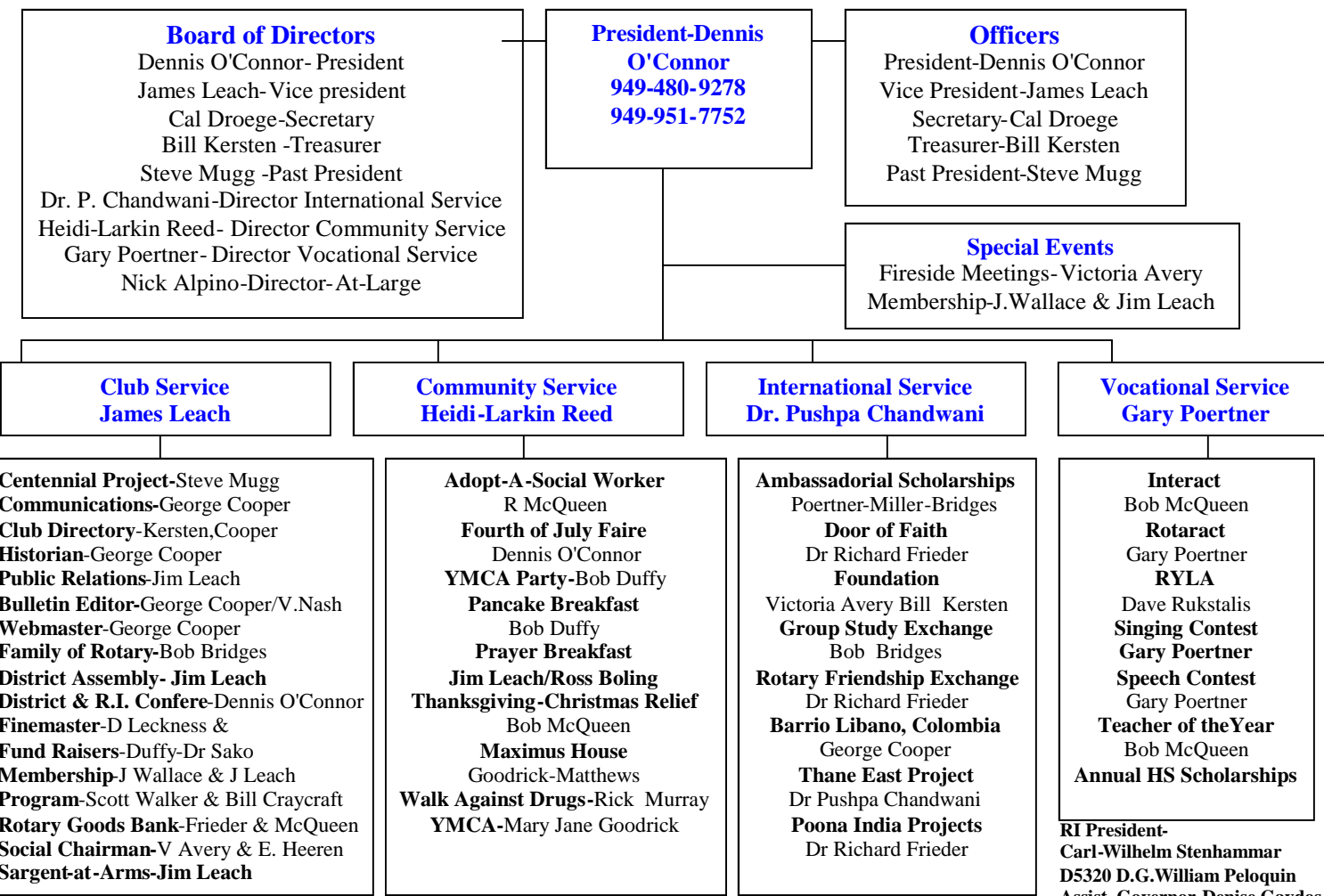

MY ASSIGNMENT WAS TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT NIXON

Last week's program is certainly one of the more memorable and interesting of the year. Our speaker, Lee Evert told of his experience during the cold war when he was a member of our Counter Intelligence (Office of Special Investigations-US Air Force).

Lee's assignment along with his team members was to test the security protecting President Nixon. They acted as the enemy and use whatever the enemy would use to kill the president. The assignment was to hit four areas:

1. Presidential yacht— Scuba diving was used but test failed and one member almost drowned.
2. Marine Helicopter— Three helicopters stood by for President's use and no one new which one would be chosen (3 balls were used to pick the helicopter) Marines guarding had orders to shoot to kill if any one got near the helicopters and this attempt by team failed and they almost lost an agent.
3. Air Force One. The team succeeded by disguising an agent as an Air Force General. The guards bought it and poison gas pellets were planted on Air force one.
4. Camp David— Team succeeded by taking photos of Security badges on guards clothing and then used them to penetrate Camp David buildings and leave poison gas pellets in toilet tissues.
