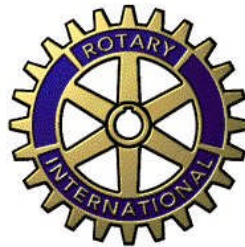

BILL GREENFIELD GIVES CRAFT TALK

. Our program was a craft talk with Bill Greenfield giving us the talk. Bill told about his starting with the computer business in 1959 and the problems that they had to solve over the years. From key punch cards to big 36 inch discs to recording tape and the intricacies of going from ideas to use of computers.

He mentioned that one of their early memory drums could handle 7 megabytes and had a hard drive that had 80 megabytes. Trying to come up with a magnesium disc that could be implanted with information and the problems with hydraulic systems and various speed painting for the early storage devices, from research and development to manufacturing and then to be bought out by IBM. Sometimes in manufacturing material would fly off the discs and the only to get clean was to use freon to get it off. Bill was in Europe two different times and watched the business grow from not too much to \$88 million in 18 months in the European market was a growth not seen very often. All in all Bill's talk was very informative and historical from the start of computers to our PC's and laptops.

PROGRAM OF SEPT 5, 2006 SUN POWER LINK



The Mission Viejo Rotary Club enjoyed a visit from Mr. Duane Cave of Sempra Energy who gave a very interesting and informative on energy concerns for the South County in the very near future. Sunrise Power Link has already the need for new power in the South County and San Diego county area and is currently working on new sources and trying to meet new demands that are coming up. They are increasing the sources of renewable power, Solar energy systems, and geothermal energy.

They are in hopes of meeting the future needs up to 2010 with systems that have been approved and are working on new transmission lines from the Imperial Valley to the San Diego area. Questions about relative costs with overhead transmission lines versus underground lines, Nuclear energy, Solar power, wind turbines, and the like were answered with great answers. A question about using hydroelectric power was asked and it has been found that the water flow in Southern California is not sufficient to improve the power to be produced. SDG&E will have met the new standards by 2010 and the mandatory date is 2017. It was pointed out that we all want Reliable, Renewable and Affordable power and the new PowerLink is trying to do just that. The old "NIMBY" was addressed and PowerLink is in hopes that some of that thinking can be overcome with their new plans and procedures. **-Verl Nash**
